

TOWN OF TROY BOARD MEETING

October 11, 2022

The regular Town of Troy board meeting was called to order by chairman, Jeff Lohr, at 7:30 p.m., at the Town of Troy town hall.

The pledge of allegiance was led by chairman, Jeff Lohr.

Roll call was taken with the following responding: Jeff Lohr, Brad Anderson, Greg Sprecher, Lloyd E. Ballweg, and Mary Zins.

It was confirmed that the agenda was properly posted in three locations in the township and mailed to all board members.

Sprecher made a motion, seconded by Lohr, to adopt the agenda as posted. Motion carried 3-0.

Minutes:

Sprecher made a motion to approve the September 13, 2022, minutes as presented, seconded by Anderson. Motion carried 3-0.

Treasurer's Report:

Anderson made a motion approving the accounts payable checks #9153-#9181 and ACH payments totaling \$22,319.89. Motion carried 3-0.

Citizen's Comments:

Jeff Lohr thanked Greg Sprecher for locating the missing road signs.

Patrolman's Report:

Patrolman, Kyle Elliott, informed the board that he is cutting brush, completing the task of mowing the right-of-ways, and is preparing the trucks for the winter season.

Board members stated that when the patrolman is doing road work, safety clothing should be always worn. Sprecher indicated a boom mower is not available from Mid-State.

Business Items:

Peter Maestri approached the town board requesting approval to add a bathroom facility to an existing building located on Parcel #036-0307-00000, Sec. 24, T9N, R4E, in the township. Supporting documents were submitted to the town board. The Plan Commission recommended approval of the structure contingent on Mr. Maestri obtaining a building permit on the local level.

With the recommended approval of the Town of Troy Plan Commission, Lohr made a motion, seconded by Sprecher, to approve the construction of the proposed convenience bathroom provided the above-mentioned permit is obtained. Motion carried 3-0.

The Sauk County clerk's office notified the town clerk that the county supervisors erroneously added a second ward for voting in the township. The board was requested to approve Amended Resolution 3-21—Adopting a Tentative County Supervisor District Plan. Anderson made a motion, seconded by Sprecher, approving the above-mentioned Amended Resolution 3-21. Motion carried 3-0.

The November board meeting conflicts with the November 8, 2022, General Election. Therefore, Anderson made a motion, seconded by Sprecher, to schedule the board meeting on November 15, 2022. Motion carried 3-0.

Anderson made a motion, seconded by Sprecher, to schedule the budget hearing at 7:00 p.m. prior to the November board meeting. Motion carried 3-0.

Lohr made a motion, seconded by Sprecher, to work on the 2023 town budget on Wednesday, October 26, 2022, at 7:00 p.m. Motion carried 3-0.

Sprecher made a motion, seconded by Anderson, to send a garbage/recycling letter explaining the change to garbage/recycling pickup to town residents. Motion carried 3-0.

Anderson made a motion, seconded by Sprecher, to transfer funds from the blacktop/cold mix and contingency ledger accounts to cover the ledger accounts in deficit. Motion carried 3-0.

Board Comments:

Anderson reported on a recent Plain/Ambulance meeting. The mill rate will be lower for 2023 and a new fire truck has been ordered.

Lohr reported on a recent Sauk Fire meeting. It was suggested that only one representative from each district be represented and beginning January 1, 2023, the fire district will no longer compensate the representatives for meetings.

Troy was not eligible for funds from the State Surface Transportation Program. MSA will do a bridge inspection in the township.

The board instructed the clerk to inform Brendan Nolden a driveway permit is needed to the agricultural driveway he is creating.

Anderson made a motion to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Sprecher. Motion carried 3-0. Meeting adjourned at 8:30 p.m.
